Donald P. Moore graduated cum laude with a Bachelor of Arts degree from Southeastern Louisiana University in 1988. He received his Juris Doctor, cum laude, from Tulane University's School of Law in 1991.

Donald joined Franke & Salloum, PLLC after graduation and admission to the Louisiana Bar in 1991. In 1993, he was admitted to practice law in Mississippi.
